Revising Guidelines

Things to keep in mind and questions to ask when revising a song.

- 1. What is the Central point of this song? Is it too broad or too narrow? Does my whole song center on making this central point?
- 2. Does it sound unique or does it sound cliché? Can I find ways to make parts I think are cliché sound unique?
- 3. Does it work mechanically? Does the form seem clear? Do the words lay out in a natural meter? Does the rhyme scheme seem effortless or is it forced?
- 4. Can I hear this song being sung in a different voice than my own?
- 5. Does this song have something that makes it unique?
- 6. What is the weakest point in this song? How can I reimagine it to take the conclusion in a different direction?
- 7. Does any part of this song make me feel strongly in one way or another? Can I put that point of high-emotion in a more prominent place? Can I build into it and make it the conclusion of the song?
- 8. Does this song show or does it tell?
- 9. Can you see the images from this song in your head?
- 10. Can you be more specific or detailed?
- 11. Do all your textures match up?
- 12. Does your form or structure have meaning? Does each section represent something? Could you change the form or structure to better reinforce your character or narrative?
- 13. Would changing the texture of the song change the overarching emotion of the song?
- 14. Does this song represent you? Do you see yourself in it?
- 15. Do you understand the song?
- 16. How does this song make you feel?
- 17. What is your five-second elevator pitch for this song?
- 18. Is any part of the song intentionally obtuse? Why?
